Thank you for your letter to the World Bank President, Robert Zoellick, regarding the 2nd Anniversary of the 2005 Declaration of the G8 Africa Action Plan and the charge for African governments to show leadership in promoting women's and men's rights to sexual and reproductive health.

First, let me reassure you Sir, that the World Bank does not impose policies of any kind on developing countries. The Bank, whose mission is the alleviation of poverty and inequality, sees its role as supporting the development needs that countries themselves identify, and which they request our help in implementing, along with global and bilateral development partners, such as the United Nations, the UK Department for International Development (DFID), USAID, and others.

In response to your specific concerns about family planning and reproductive health, the Bank's efforts in this area are part of our broader efforts to carry out a new health, nutrition, and population strategy that will help developing countries strengthen their health systems to improve the health and well-being of millions of the world's poorest people, boost economic growth, reduce poverty caused by catastrophic illness, and provide the structural 'glue' that combines multiple health-related programs within client countries.

We also need to work with countries to help them better educate their girls and young women, to provide them with equal economic opportunities in society, and to improve national economic performance to have fewer households living below the poverty line. These are also vital parts of a strategy to reduce poverty, which is our primary goal.
